



Report on 03-Day Internal Assessor's cum Service Provider Training on National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS)

Introduction

The National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS), introduced in 2013, aim to enhance the Quality of Care in public health facilities, beginning with District Hospitals. Subsequently, Community Health Centres and Primary Health Centres with beds were included in 2014, followed by standards for Urban Primary Health Centres in 2016. Over the years, specialized initiatives such as LaQshya (2019), SUMAN (2020), and MusQan (2021) have been integrated within the NQAS framework to address maternity, newborn, and child health services.

The NQAS standards, accredited by ISQua and recognized by IRDA for hospital empanelment, provide a robust framework for quality improvement. Since the inception of the program in 2013, its implementation in the North-Eastern States has been actively supported by the Regional Resource Centre for Northeast States (RRC-NE), in coordination with NHSRC.

With technical support from RRC-NE, the State Quality Assurance (QA) Team, NHM Tripura, organized a three-day Internal Assessor-cum-Service Provider Training (IASPT) from 27th to 29th August 2025 at SIHFW Building, Agartala, Tripura. The training aimed at strengthening the pool of trained assessors and equipping participants with knowledge and skills required for NQAS assessments. The agenda of the three-day training is placed as Annexure – I.

Objectives and Participants

The primary objectives of the training were to:

- Familiarize participants with the concepts and framework of NQAS.
- Build capacity in using departmental checklists, standards, and measurable elements.
- Strengthen internal assessment, gap analysis, and action planning skills.
- Support facilities in moving towards national quality certification.

Training was facilitated by following Resource Persons:

Participants: A total of 33 (thirty-three) participants including Medical Superintendent, Medical Officers, Nursing officers, Consultants, Lab Technicians attended the training. The participants list along with the post training evaluation result is enclosed as Annexure – II.

Inaugural Session: Dr. Nupur Debbarma, Member Secretary, SHFWS-Government of Tripura, welcomed all the participants & resource persons from RRCNE to the 03-day State Level Internal Assessor's cum Service Providers Training Program. She highlighted the importance of NQAS and stressed on the importance of the internal assessor training and urged all the participants to gain maximum knowledge from it. Additionally, she mentioned that after the training, they would help to strengthen the state's NQAS certification process thereby facilitating the state to achieve 100 % NQAS certification.

Dr. Ishita Guha, SPO-RCH, also welcomed all participants and stressed on the importance of NQAS and urged the participants to take active participation in the training. This was followed by technical sessions.

Post Training Evaluation: The RRC-NE QPS team conducted a post-training evaluation of the participants using an objective-type questionnaire. A total of 33 participants attended the training and post training evaluation. Out of the 33 participants, only 24 qualified (73%) in the post training evaluation. The evaluation result is enclosed as Annexure – II.

Post Training Feedback: Feedback on the three-day training program was collected from all participants. As part of the NQAS training framework, an inbuilt evaluation system is followed wherein each participant shares feedback on a 5-point Likert scale. The purpose of this exercise was to assess the effectiveness of the training, identify potential areas for improvement, and capture insights on the overall learning experience. A detailed analysis of the training feedback is provided in Annexure – III.

The training program concluded with closing remarks, and a vote of thanks was delivered by Dr. Anirban Hore, State Quality Consultant, NHM-Tripura. In his address, Dr. Hore extended heartfelt appreciation to all participants and trainers for their active engagement and valuable contributions throughout the sessions. The participants shared positive feedback, appreciating the training and technical sessions. They expressed that the program had significantly enhanced their knowledge and skills in healthcare quality, which they are committed to apply in their respective facilities.
